CHAPTER I

NAME, NATURE, ADDRESS AND DURATION

Article 1

Name and Nature

The Jaqi Aru Foundation, whose acronym is FJA, is a non-profit multidisciplinary foundation that does not carry out commercial activity or financial intermediation activity governed by its bylaws, internal regulations, and subject to the legal regime established by Art. 21 Num. 4 the Political Constitution of the State and the Civil Code in Art. 67.

Article 2

Address and Duration

Its main domicile is located at Calle "H" N ° 500 between Av. Sanjinés, Plan 482, Ciudad Satélite zone of El Alto - La Paz, it is constituted in the headquarters, being able to establish offices in any place of the departmental territory. The Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. It will have an indefinite duration.

CHAPTER II
OF THE OBJECT
Article 3
Object

1. Mission

Strengthen the management and development of projects and linguistic, socio-cultural, technological and productive research for the construction of a balanced, fair and harmonious society - Suma Qamaña in cultural diversity.

2. Vision

Becoming an articulating foundation in the process of building a balanced, fair and harmonious society ¬- Qamaña sum in cultural diversity.

3. Values and principles

The values and community principles that characterize the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. they are: complementarity, reciprocity (Ayni, Mink'a, Jayma, Waki), duality, equity, integrity, peace, love, justice, social inclusion and respect for Mother Earth and those established in Art. 2 of the Law against Racism and all forms of discrimination.

4. Objectives

General purpose

Promote linguistic, socio-cultural, technological and productive strengthening through research and projects to support the development of a balanced, fair and harmonious society in rural and urban regions.

Specific objectives

- Manage, develop and execute research projects in the linguistic, socio-cultural, technological and productive through qualification programs.
- Establish relations of collaboration and the signing of agreements that are of interest to the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., with natural and legal persons such as public and private institutions, be they national or international.
- To influence research and projects in public policies in linguistics, socio-cultural, technology and production.
- Produce and publish materials, linguistic, socio-cultural, technological and other, in digital and physical format, available to the public.

Article 4

For the achievement of the object, the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., may carry out, among others, the following acts:

- Manage resources from natural and legal persons such as public or private institutions, be they social, economic, political and cultural, for the execution of plans, programs or projects for the benefit of society.
- Strengthen and qualify society in the fields of action: linguistic, socio-cultural, technological and productive through methodological strategies contextualized to the social environment of the country.

Cooperate and support researchers and strategic planners.

CHAPTER III

OF THE MEMBERS

Article 5

Individuals can be members whether national or foreign, as long as they identify with the objectives pursued by the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A.. Members are classified as: founders, honorary and regular.

All members, whatever their quality, are obliged to comply with and enforce the Organic Statute and the Internal Regulations. The members shall exercise their rights, perform their duties, assume their positions and functions for which they were appointed.

Article 6

Founders members

They are the members that sign the Organic Statute and Internal Regulation, with the character of permanent members during the life of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., having voice and vote in the meetings of the Board of Directors.

Article 7

Honorary Members

The invited members are members of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., for their achievements and merits in the linguistic, technological, educational and socio-cultural fields.

Article 8

Regular Members

They are those who participate voluntarily and regularly in the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., with the purpose of fulfilling the objectives and general projects envisaged. Article 9

Admission Duties and Rights of members

Members' income will be according to their category:

- Honorary Members: These will be invited by the Foundation for their achievements in the linguistic, educational, technological and socio-cultural fields.
- Regular Members: These must submit a letter requesting membership to the Foundation, fill out the admission form (downloading from the website) and be of legal age.

Article 10

Homework

The duties of the members are:

- Know, respect and comply with the Organic Statute, Internal Regulation and the provisions issued by the Board.
- Perform the commissions and positions for which they are appointed according to the principles.

- Attend sessions of the Assembly of members, either in person or by virtual means such as video conference and others.
- Participate in the activities of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., in accordance with the POA and the established values and principles.
- Propose research and projects that are in accordance with the established objectives of the Foundation.

Article 11

Rights

The rights of the members are:

- Participate in the activities of the Foundation such as: study trips, representations to congresses, conferences, meetings and others.
- Intervene in the Assembly of Members with the right to speak and vote. As for honorary and regular members, they have only the right to voice.
- Be postulated and elected according to the Organic Statute, for the positions of responsibilities in the units created by the Board. In case of regular members and fees, their merits in the institution must be taken into account.
- Have free access to information, books and accounting records, balance sheets, correspondence, work papers, and other documents of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. with the exception of honorary and regular members.

Article 12

Of the Exclusion of Members

Both the founding, honorary and regular members will be irrevocably suspended from the Foundation if they incur the following faults:

- Faults against the Organic Statute and the Internal Regulations and that compromise the good name of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A ..
- Undue or fraudulent management of the funds of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A..
- For committing any crime classified in the Criminal Code that is detrimental to the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A.
- By voluntary resignation, indistinctly if it were any member.

The General Assembly will meet once a year, with a corresponding quorum of 51% of the members.

Article 17

Extraordinary assembly

The Extraordinary General Assembly shall be convened five days in advance by the Board of Directors with a pre-established agenda, indicating the time, date and place.

CHAPTER V FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Article 18

The Directory: consists of five people democratically elected among the associates and the Board of Directors is constituted by: President, Vice President, Executive Director, General Secretary and General Coordinator of Units; who perform their duties for two years adhonoren.

The attributions and duties of the Directory are:

- Comply and enforce the Organic Statute, Internal Rules, resolutions and the provisions in minutes of the Board meeting.
- Establish the general policies of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., aimed at achieving the objectives.
- Modify the Organic Statute, Internal Regulations, prior General Assembly and endorsed by it.
- Convene and direct the Assembly of Members annually.
- Manage and approve donations.
- Approve or reject the admission of new members.
- Designate the Unit Managers, for the study and development of research, projects and activities necessary for the achievement of the objectives of the Jaqi Aru Foundation, whose acronym is F.J.A ..
- Oversee the administration of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. to know, approve and execute the Annual Operating Plans, budgets, annual reports and balance sheets on the administration of the assets, real estate and economic resources presented by the President and Executive Director, to inform the Assembly of Members.
- Know, approve or veto the financial statements presented by the Vice President.
- To know and resolve disputes and matters submitted for consideration by the members, consisting of a record.
- Know and resolve about the dissolution of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., with the authorization of 2/3 of the members of the General Assembly.

CHAPTER VI
OF THE MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
Article 19

The Board meeting is the highest governance body of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. and also integrate the founding members as inspectors of the process, to fulfill the purpose for which the Foundation was established.

The board meeting may be: ordinary and / or extraordinary.

Article 20

Ordinary Board Meeting

The ordinary meeting is held quarterly, in the last week of the month corresponding to the quarter. The call is in writing and / or digital with seven business days in advance. The meetings are held regularly at the headquarters of the Foundation, and may be carried out elsewhere if they so decide. The call must indicate the place, date and time at which the meeting will take place, incorporating the agenda to be discussed.

Article 21

Extraordinary Board Meeting

The extraordinary meeting is held at the request of the simple majority of the Board or President.

Article 22

Calls

Calls to Board meetings must comply with the following provisions:

- The ordinary meeting will be convened by the President of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. and addressed to the members of the Board in writing and / or digitally seven business days in advance.
- The extraordinary meeting must be convened by the President, in writing or by any other digital means, in advance of two days.
- Decisions reached at the Board meeting, whether ordinary or extraordinary, will be binding for compliance, even for members who have not attended them.

Article 23

Quorum

The Quorum and decisions are governed by the following rules:

- For an ordinary and extraordinary meeting of the Board of Directors, it must be assisted by 2/3 of the members.
- In order for decisions to be validated, they must be consensual, in case there is no consensus by simple majority, the vote of those present at the session will be used, if there is equality, the President will have a deciding vote.

CHAPTER VII

OF THE PRESIDENT

Article 24

The president will exercise his functions with character of two years, he will be the person chosen by the assembly to exercise his functions.

In his absence, the Vice President shall hold the presidency.

Article 25

They are functions of the President:

• Exercise the legal, judicial and extrajudicial representation of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., jointly with the Executive Director, appointed by the board of directors.

- Convene ordinary and extraordinary meetings of the Board of Directors.
- Sign the minutes of meetings, meetings of the Board of Directors and General Assembly in coordination with the Secretary General.
- Present annually the Annual Operating Plans, budgets, reports, balance sheets on the administration of the goods and economic resources of the Foundation to the Board.
- Authorize with your signature, and the Executive Director, the public and private documents for the development of the objectives of the Foundation, with the prior consent of the Board.

CHAPTER VIII

OF THE VICE-PRESIDENT

Article 26

The Vice President exercises his functions for two years.

Its functions are:

- Replace the President during his temporary absences, assuming the functions of this position.
- Be responsible for the audit, presentation of accounting and other financial records annually before the Board.
- Supervise and maintain the operational funds and reserves of the Foundation.
- Collect and receive all income from the Foundation and deposit it in the same account, justifying said income, under your signature and that of the Executive Director.

CHAPTER IX

OF THE UNIT COORDINATOR GENERAL

Article 27

The General Coordinator of Units exercises its functions for two years.

Its functions are:

- Coordinate with the Units of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. for the development of the POA and present the Executive Director and the President.
- Coordinate the administration of the bibliographic material of the Institution.
- Coordinate the donation process with the Executive Director.
- Present the annual report on the work done by the units to the Board.

CHAPTER X

OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL

Article 28

The Secretary General exercises his functions for two years.

Its functions are:

- Keep the minutes of the ordinary and extraordinary meetings of the Board of Directors, as well as the documentation, files, and a copy of the Statute and Internal Rules in all meetings.
- Sign correspondence and documents inherent to the Foundation.
- Comply with the certifications requested by the Board.
- Carry the Member Pattern book.
- Keep a copy of the Foundation's written and digital materials.
- Keep a complete collection of the productions of the Foundation.

CHAPTER XI OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Article 29

The executive director will be appointed by the board of directors, will exercise his functions with character of two years; in case of temporary or permanent absence, the President exercises the legal representation of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. with the Vice President, until another is appointed by the Board.

Its functions are:

- Exercise the legal, judicial and extrajudicial representation of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. together with the President.
- Execute all contracts and payments corresponding to the administration of the Foundation, with the limitations indicated in the Organic Statute, Internal Regulations and in accordance with the preceding law and the provisions of the Board meeting.
- Authorize with your signature and that of the President, public and private documents issued for the development of the Foundation's objectives, with the prior consent of the Board.
- Coordinate the donation process with the General Coordinator.
- Administer the assets, resources, assets, real estate and funds of any species belonging to the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., in coordination with the President.
- Hire and cease their functions to the employees of the Foundation, with prior consent of the Board. Present annually the AOP, budgets, reports and balance sheets on the administration of the assets and economic resources of the Foundation to the Board of Directors.

CHAPTER XII

OF THE HERITAGE

CONSTITUTION SOURCE OF RESOURCES AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE HERITAGE Article 30

The heritage of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. it is formed by:

- Movable and immovable property that you have and can acquire in the future.
- Donations in cash, movable and immovable property or other contributions made by natural or legal persons, national or foreign, as well as legacies, inheritances and any other form of legal cooperation that may be carried out in the future.
- Bank accounts in the name of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., in any bank of the department.
- Contributions received under any title from the State or other private institutions, both national and foreign.

Article 31

The Management and Administration of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. it corresponds to the Executive Director jointly with the President, who will be in charge of the administration of the goods and economic resources. They must give a balance on the administration of these.

The activities of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., will be closed on December 15 of each year, starting on January 15 of the following year.

CHAPTER XIII

OF THE MODIFICATION

Article 33

This Statute may be modified in whole or in part by the vote of 2/3 of the present members of the Board. The quorum required to carry out this voting will be 50% plus 1 of the members in the General Assembly.

CHAPTER XIV

OF EXTINCTION AND LIQUIDATION

Article 34

The Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. is extinguished for causes established in Art. 64 of the Civil Code:

- It can be agreed upon in an extraordinary meeting of the General Assembly, for which it must consist of a quorum of 90% and with more than 80% of the votes represented in the session. The dissolution resolution must be ratified by another meeting of the board of directors convened for the purpose, with an interval of 24 hours between this and the previous one.
- Because the purpose for which it was created has been achieved or impossible.
- For not being able to function according to the Organic Statute.
- By judicial decision, at the request of the Public Ministry, when it develops activities contrary to public order or good customs.
- By voluntary decision of the Board of Directors, brought to the attention of the other members.

Article 35

In the event of liquidation, the assets will be distributed among entities with the same purpose or donated to public institutions. As established in Art. 65 of the Civil Code.

JAQI ARU FOUNDATION - F.J.A. RULES OF PROCEDURE

Article 1

The purpose of this Regulation is to regulate the Statute of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A.

Article 2

The address of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. it may be changed and / or expanded upon prior presentation of the reasons by the board of directors and be approved by the meeting, provided that it does not affect the free development of the Foundation's activities.

Article 3

The Assembly of Members will be held annually in the first week of October, to which all members of the Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A. will attend, and will be chaired by the Board.

Article 4

Members who appear in the Member Standard Book may attend the Assembly of Members and participate in the discussions.

Article 5

The participation of the heads of Units in Board meetings is limited specifically to their competence.

Article 6

General Coordinator of Units:

The General Coordinator is responsible for coordinating in a responsible and efficient manner the instructions issued by the Board; support in the management, planning, execution, evaluation and monitoring of the POA.

Article 7

Research unit:

The Research Unit will be responsible for promoting, developing and carrying out research in the four areas of action: educational, linguistic, socio-cultural and technological. The research unit will execute what is established in the POA, in coordination with the other units, with the prior approval of the Board.

The unit will have a Unit Manager and the number of members it deems necessary for the development of its activities. The Head of Unit will be in charge of this before the General Coordinator, who will present annual reports.

Article 8

Project Unit:

The Projects Unit will be responsible for managing educational, linguistic, socio-cultural and technological projects, coordinating with different public and private institutions, both national and international.

The unit will have a Unit Manager and the number of members it deems necessary for the development of its activities. The Head of Unit will be in charge of this before the General Coordinator, who will present annual reports.

Article 9

Promotion and Communication Unit:

The Promotion and Communication Unit will be responsible for managing the systematization, edition and publication of research works related to the areas of action.

He is in charge of the public relations of the Foundation, with several regional, national, international, private and public institutions, in order to contribute to the development of the Foundation.

The Promotion and Communication Unit will have the following functions:

- Dissemination of all the Foundation's activities in all written, radio, television and electronic media.
- Press articles that are delivered to the media.
- Disseminate newsletters, brochures and any printing published by the Foundation, in addition to digital documents in multilingual.
- Manage the protocol of the social events of the Foundation.
- Permanently update and enrich the institutional website.

The unit will have a Unit Manager and the number of members it deems necessary for the development of its activities. The Head of Unit will be in charge of this before the General Coordinator, who will present annual reports.

Article 10

Finance Administration Unit:

The Finance Administration Unit will be composed of an auditor or accountant who will be responsible for the accounting of the Foundation as well as preparing reports, balance sheets, reports, to be presented to the competent entities.

Article 11

Legal advice:

Legal advice is temporary staff.

The legal advice will be composed of a lawyer who will be responsible for the management and legal analysis of the Foundation. It will also present reports according to the resolved cases, which will be evaluated in meetings of the Board of Directors.

Article 12

Honorary Members:

Honorary members are temporary staff.

They are responsible for coordinating with the corresponding Units and executing specific activities that the Foundation promotes through their projects in their fields of action.

Article 13

The Board of Directors reserves the right to decide under which license any document, project, magazine, brochure, audiovisual production, software, and any print or digital format published or published by the Foundation will be published.

Article 14

The relations of cooperation established with natural and legal persons such as public and private institutions, be they social, economic, political, cultural and national or foreign financing agencies, should be subject to framework agreements chronologically ordered; those who will be in charge of the president.

Article 15

The employment relationship

Any type of advice provided by the Foundation must have prior authorization from the Board, it will be recorded in the respective minutes.

Article 17

The stamp of the Foundation will indicate the name of: Jaqi Aru Foundation whose acronym is F.J.A., in round form, in the center will be the Andean cross and the address, the number of the legal personality, in addition to the characteristic logo.

Article 18

These Internal Regulations may be amended and / or supplemented at any time by the Board of Directors, with the prior authorization of the members of the foundation with the approval of 98% of the total of the general meeting.
