Introducing the Policy gap analysis work

- Starting point The ccNSO is the policy authority for the global policy framework that defines how IANA relates to ccTLDs in the rootzone
- **ICANN78 Hamburg** Council Workshop inspired by the creation of a "Caretaker Operations" designation for a ccTLD (June 2023)
- Small group of Councillors to consider and explore these and other matters, to prepare for broad community engagement on what to do next (ICANN79 & ICANN 80 sessions)
- Considered three key questions all sensitive and complex. Should the ccNSO work to:
 - Consolidate existing policy?
 - Identify gaps in existing policy?
 - Explore ways to deal with future unknowns?

The Policy Gap Analysis Working Group - Purpose

- 1. Complete preparation of an overview of ccNSO policies and guidance related to ccTLDs and present the overview at ICANN81.
- 2. Provide details to Council and ccTLD community on any of the gaps in the current policies, guidance or practices pertaining to governing the delegation, transfer, revocation and retirement of ccTLDs, and other related IANA Naming Function Services for ccTLDs (hereafter: Gaps, or Gap).
- 3. Advise the ccNSO Council if, the order and how these Gaps need to be addressed by the ccNSO.

The PGA WG's scope of activities

- In close cooperation with the PTI, analyse those topics and Gaps relevant from a ccTLD and/or ccNSO perspective.
 - Build on work of the ad-hoc group and relevant staff papers, and
 - Propose an order to address those Gaps.
- Identify, and further detail the various methods to address Gaps, and propose to the ccNSO Council and community which method to use to address a specific Gap.
- Organise a ccTLD-focused working session during ICANN81
 - to introduce the Gaps,
 - the order to address them,
 - and related proposed methods.
- Undertake any other activity deemed necessary by the WG to achieve the objective of the WG.

Explore and detail Gaps in the current policies, guidance or practices

- Detail and analyse outcome discussions ICANN79 and 80 sessions on:
 - Transfer or change of ccTLD management
 - Data accuracy
 - Purpose of public Records
 - Eligibility assessment before making changes to ccTLD management
 - Enforcement and/or graduated compliant options
- Explore and detail additional Gaps
 - Local Presence requirements
 - Other to be identified
