

Evolved roles and functions:

Administrative

- Manages ccNSO daily affairs
- Elects Chair and Vice-chairs

Representative • Represents the ccNSO at ICANN level

Governance • Selects ICANN Board members







15 Councillors elected by ccTLDs

3 Councillors selected by NomCom

- 3) elected by ccNSO members (from that region)




