

- country code Top Level Domains
- 2-character TLDs: .jp (Japan), .ke (Kenia)
- country, territory, or other geographic location (ISO 3166-1)




Why are ccTLDs important?



209.4 million gTLDs

Top 10 largest TLDs by number of reported domains contain **7 ccTLDs**: .com, .tk, .cn, .de, .net, .uk, .org, .icu, .nl, .ru


















Bylaw definition, Article 10:

ICANN Policy Development body, which shall be responsible for:

- Developing and recommending to the Board global policies relating to countrycode top-level domains;
- Nurturing consensus across the ccNSO community, including the name-related activities of ccTLDs;
- Coordinating with other ICANN Supporting Organizations, committees, and constituencies under ICANN.

The ccNSO may also engage in other activities authorized by its members.

Purpose and Value of the ccNSO


The ccNSO provides a **global platform** for country code Top Level Domain (ccTLD) Managers to:

- Undertake policy and policy related work,
- Nurture technical cooperation and skill building, share practices and discuss topics of mutual interest and concern
- Engage with and be informed about other stakeholders in the ICANN environment on topics of mutual interest

The ccNSO is (1) of (3) ICANN SOs and (1) of (5) DPs and has to carry out related responsibilities required and mandated by the Bylaws.






- Membership in the ccNSO is currently open to all ccTLD managers responsible for managing an ISO 3166-1 country code Top-Level Domain.

The role of ccTLD managers

- Contribute as volunteers to the work of the ccNSO and other SO/ACs
- As per the ICANN bylaws:
 - Elect Councillors (Bylaws)
 - Final vote on the ccNSO PDP
- As per voluntary arrangement:
 - Nominate Candidates Board members seat 11 and 12
 - 10% of all ccNSO members may call for a vote on all ccNSO Council decisions




ccNSO Working Groups

ccNSO Council

The ccNSO Council is responsible for managing the policy development process of the ccNSO. However, the role of the Council evolved:

- Manages ccNSO affairs
- Represents the ccNSO
- Selects ICANN Board members (Bylaws: after suggestion of members)
- Appoints ccNSO Chair and Vice-Chairs

- Council leadership team is annually elected at ICANN Community Forum
- 18 Council members:

3 AF, 3 AP, 3 EU, 3 LAC, 3 NA: elected by ccNSO members from those regions plus 3 NomCom appointed Councillors





ccNSO Policy Development

SCOPE | Defined in Annex C - ICANN Bylaws

- Limited scope for Policy Development
- Out of scope: all policies relating to registration of ccTLD domain names (local ccTLD policies)
- Policy applies to ccTLDs by virtue of membership, however major exceptions (applicable law and breach local custom, religion or public policy)

PROCESS | Defined in Annex B - ICANN Bylaws

- Heavy handed process
- Members vote, after Council vote
- Structural engagement GAC

CURRENTLY

- One ccPDP completed
- ccPDP3 ongoing part 1: on retirement of ccTLDs; part 2: independent review mechanism decision relating to delegation, revocation, transfer and retirement of ccTLDs
- ccPDP4 ongoing: overall IDN ccTLD policy



ccPDP3: Retirement ccTLDs

This third ccNSO policy development process (PDP) related to the retirement of country code top-level domains (ccTLDs).

It aims to develop policy recommendations for the ICANN Board, which will include a review mechanism pertaining to decision on the delegation, transfer, revocation, and retirement of ccTLDs.

- Phase 1: focused on the *retirement* of the delegated Top-Level Domains associated with alpha-2 codes assigned to countries and territories listed in the ISO 3166-1 standard. Interim Report is out for public comments now. Read more <u>here</u>.
- **Phase 2:** focus lies on the *review mechanisms*. Read more <u>here</u>.

ccPDP4: IDN ccTLDs


Policy Development Process (PDP) on Internationalized Domain Name (IDN) country code Top-Level Domain (ccTLD) strings.

This PDP will address a <u>limited set of issues</u> related to the selection of IDN ccTLD strings, including:

- the review of the confusing similarity evaluation process, criteria and methods for the requested IDN ccTLD strings;
- the development of policy proposals for managing IDN variant labels for top-level domains


