


Introduction to the ccNSO

What does ccNSO stand for?

- ccNSO: Country Code Names Supporting Organization
 - Created for and by ccTLD managers.
- ccTLD manager: organization or entity responsible for managing a ccTLD
- ccTLD: country code top-level domain

 Registration policies and governance models vary significantly across ccTLDs.


- These are defined locally.
 - Not through ICANN processes.

- The ccNSO develops policies for a very limited set of issues relating to ccTLDs, such as:
 - Delegation,
 - Transfer,
 - Revocation, and
 - Retirement of ccTLDs
- Or the introduction of IDN ccTLDs.






Composition of the ccNSO

- Share experiences and information




What does the ccNSO Council do?

- Administers and coordinates the affairs of the ccNSO.
- Manages the development of policy recommendations.
- The Councilors are actively involved in:
 - Setting the course of the ccNSO
 - Leading and participating in various ccNSO working groups
 - Engaging the community in topical issues
 - Developing positions based on community input



Who sits on the Council?

- Individuals elected in their personal capacity and serve the ccTLD community
- Councillors do not represent the views and interests of their employers







ccNSO policy development

- ccPDP3 Retirement of ccTLDs
- ccPDP3 Review Mechanism for decisions pertaining to:
 - delegation,
 - transfer,
 - revocation and
 - retirement of ccTLDs
- ccPDP4 IDN to define the criteria, process, and procedures for (de)selecting Internationalized Domain Name country code Top Level Domain strings (IDN ccTLDS)
 - The results of this ccPDP4 will eventually replace ICANN's IDN ccTLD Fast Track Process.

 - Whether the ccTLD manager is a member of the ccNSO or not




