# Levels of involvement

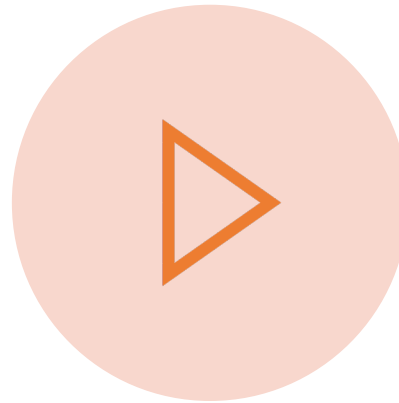
Each level of involvement exponentially increases:

- the levels of participation by the audience
- the role for the session chair.



LEVEL 1:

PRESENTING & REPORTING



LEVEL 2:

LIMITED PARTICIPATION



LEVEL 3:

EXTENSIVE DISCUSSION

# Important !

---



- Plan the appropriate level of involvement well in advance
- Allow for appropriate amount of time for dialogue
- Come prepared
- Start on time, end on time
- Check the detailed schedule in the google doc, to verify how much time is allocated to each session or presenter

# Tips & tricks: increase the level of involvement (1)

## Questions

- Open with a question
- Allow for questions from the audience throughout the presentation
- Invite the audience to type questions in the Zoom chat
- Ask for reactions, do not only ask for questions
- Share a final story after the Q&A

# Tips & tricks: increase the level of involvement (2)

## Measure the temperature

- Show of cards
- Vote with your feet
- Ask for feedback on a certain topic prior to a presentation, and see whether the feedback changed after the presentation

- World Café
- Moderated panel discussion
