

#### What is the IGF?

- Started in 2006
- Global multi-stakeholder dialogue on public policy issues related to key elements of Internet governance issues
  - Internet's sustainability, robustness, security, stability and development



### Two main aspects of the IGF

- Multi-stakeholderism
- 2. Non-decision making body








What is the purpose of the IGF?

- opportunity for open and inclusive dialogue and the exchange of ideas
- create opportunities to share best practices and experiences
- identify emerging issues and bring them to the attention of the relevant bodies
- capacity building









Who is the IGF for?

### Organizational Structure

- Multi-stakeholder Advisory Group (MAG)
- Assist in convening the IGF
- Members are from international governments, the commercial private sector and public civil society, including academic and technical communities
- Coordinate with the IGF secretariat



# National and Regional IGF Initiatives (NRIs)

- gather local communities to undertake open consultations and develop an annual IGF meeting, that addresses key issues of concern locally, or regionally
- Classified as: national, sub-regional, regional and Youth IGFs











### Core Principles





Youth Internet Governance Forum -Asia Pacific (yIGF)



#### How it started?

- Since 2010 (8 yIGFs)
- First batch of NetMission ambassadors felt the need for youth-led initiative to engage more young people after attending the IGF 2009
- yIGF development model:
  For youth By youth
  - Learning from ambassadors
  - Modification by alumni
  - Legacy





#### Youth IGF Initiative

- Same multi-stakeholder approach as the IGF
- usually a 4-day-3-night camp
- provides an open platform to express and interchange their ideas and own thoughts freely
- serves as a preparation camp to understand various Internet issues and open their door to the international policy discussion
- Networking platform for connecting alike people

- Interactive sessions/games (related to internet governance or highlights an aspect of internet governance)


