Lisa Phifer: (08:27) Proposed Recommendation: ICANN Board should direct WHOIS ARS project team to look into the potentially-anomalous closed tickets because the WHOIS record changed, to analyze who did the updates (registrant or registrar), why the WHOIS data was updated, possible linkage with ARS, etc. Based on the analyzing,

WHOIS ARS project team should revise the follow-up.

Lisa Phifer: (08:28) From F2F3

Lisa Phifer: (08:28) ACTION ITEM - Lili to generate a recommendation that the ARS team look for potentially-anomalous results (e.g., 40% of ARS-generated tickets closed with no action because the WHOIS record changed) to determine the underlying cause

Stephanie Perrin: (08:29) aha, no tool bar

Lisa Phifer: (08:33) Here is a possible recommendation along the lines of the F2F:

Lisa Phifer: (08:33) The ICANN Board should direct the ARS team to look for potentially-anomalous results (e.g., 40% of ARS-generated tickets closed with no action because the WHOIS record changed) to determine the underlying cause and take appropriate action to reduce anomolies.

Cathrin Bauer-Bulst: (08:33) that sounds good to me, Lisa.

Stephanie Perrin: (08:37) Can we please have GDD talk to the whole team

Stephanie Perrin: (08:38) It seems to me the new recommendation is far too detailed, when there are so many questions about procedure and priorities.

Stephanie Perrin: (08:38) I like Lisa's proposed wording

Cathrin Bauer-Bulst: (08:38) perhaps we can include a number of examples of what we mean by anomalies to ensure that the recommendation is not simply ignored

Cathrin Bauer-Bulst: (08:39) not everyone might classify this as an anomaly

Lisa Phifer: (08:40) @Cathrin, the rationale could cite the examples and ask specifically why so many records are found to have changed

Lisa Phifer: (08:40) Including Volker's example

Cathrin Bauer-Bulst: (08:40) yes that would also work

Lisa Phifer: (08:40) to illustrate delay

Lisa Phifer: (08:41) Note that we are not now in a data gathering phase, but presenting draft recommendations. Let's focus on what the draft recommendation will say in this month's report

Lisa Phifer: (08:42) Alternative text per Alan's suggestion: The ICANN Board should direct the ICANN Organization to look for potentially-anomalous ARS results (e.g., 40% of ARS-generated tickets closed with no action because the WHOIS record changed) to determine the underlying cause and take appropriate action to reduce anomalies.

Stephanie Perrin: (09:12) what precisely is a related professional

Lisa Phifer: (09:13) @Cathrin, LE.2 needs to be framed as a standalone recommendation (e., the ICANN Board

should direct WHO? to conduct additional studies...)

Chris Disspain: (09:15) I am back on the phone

Lisa Phifer: (09:15) @ Alan, yes, the action was to tie this recommendation to the needs of Law Enforcement Stephanie Perrin: (09:16) law enforcement itsself is too vague. Are we not talking about criminal law here?

Stephanie Perrin: (09:16) cybersecurity professionals is not a meaningful ter.

Stephanie Perrin: (09:16) term

Lisa Phifer: (09:16) There is a definition of law enforcement on pages 1-2 of this report

Lisa Phifer: (09:16) as applies to this subgroup's work Stephanie Perrin: (09:20) Carlton please mute your min

Lisa Phifer: (09:20) I don't see how you can change the subgroup's working definition at this point. You can adjust

the expanded audience if you tie it to law enforcement needs

Lisa Phifer: (09:23) From page 2 of this subgroup's report: The subgroup reviewed the definition of law enforcement used by the previous WHOIS Review Team, which was the following: Law enforcement is "any entity charged or otherwise mandated by governments with enforcing or ensuring observance of or obedience to the law; an organized body of people officially maintained or employed to keep order, prevent or detect crime and enforce the law."

Alan Greenberg: (09:23) Let's not revisit that work now!

Lisa Phifer: (09:23) The previous WHOIS Review Team added the following considerations: The adopted definition intentionally does not include private individuals and organizations, such as anti-spam groups or those bringing civil enforcement actions, whose efforts may be viewed as within a larger concept of law enforcement. By adopting the narrower definition, the Team does not intend to discount the value of private sector efforts to curb abusive uses of the DNS. The definition was maintained for the purposes of the present review.

Lisa Phifer: (09:24) That would be the definition used in LE.1

Lisa Phifer: (09:24) Any expansion in LE.2 would go beyond that definition

Lisa Phifer: (09:25) @Cathrin, such a general recommendation might go under bylaws changes?

Lisa Phifer: (09:26) If future reviews should consider effectiveness of RDS in meeting the needs of other parties with a legitimate purpose beyond meeting LE needs

Stephanie Perrin: (09:31) Sorry, have to go as call is ending now....I will have to listen to the recording as audio was sketchy throughout. This doubles time, can we find out what is up with adobe....do we need updates or something.

Volker Greimann - RrSG 2: (09:33) What is a "cybersecurity specialist" though?

Stephanie Perrin: (09:33) we have no idea without accredittation standards.

Lisa Phifer: (09:34) those who support law enforcement?

Charla Shambley: (09:34) @Stephanie -- IT is aware of the audio issue and is working with AC and PGi to resolve the problem

Volker Greimann - RrSG 2: (09:35) what does "working with" mean?

Volker Greimann - RrSG 2: (09:35) submitting reports?

Volker Greimann - RrSG 2: (09:36) just do not want any block wardens to be included
