- Discussion with ICANN org following-up on review team's request:

“Why so many ARS-generated tickets are closed with no action (are the records changed, the domains transferred or not renewed, etc)”

- **Review/refine proposed R5.1:**

The ICANN Board should direct the ICANN Organization to look for potentially-anomalous ARS results (e.g., 40% of ARS-generated tickets closed with no action because the RDS (WHOIS) record changed) to determine the underlying cause and take appropriate action to reduce anomalies.

- **Review Volker's proposed changes to Rec.2**

The ICANN Board should direct ICANN Organization to review grandfathered domain names to determine the percentage of such domains where information is missing from the RDS Registrant field. If more than 15% of all gTLD domain name registrations are found to lack data in the Registrant field that is required under the 2013 RAA but not required under the 2009 RAA, then the ICANN Board should initiate action intended to ensure that all gTLD domain names adhere to the same registration data collection requirements [within 12 months] provided that such action does not unduly impact the rights of registrants in the use of their domain name and does not create an undue burden upon registrars who would have to enforce any such requirement.

Suggested Bylaw Amendment OECD

Scope of the present RDS-WHOIS2 Review, section 4.6(e)(iii) of the Bylaws was considered:

"The review team for the Directory Service Review ("Directory Service Review Team") will consider the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development ("OECD") Guidelines on the Protection of Privacy and Transborder Flows of Personal Data as defined by the OECD in 1980 and amended in 2013 and as may be amended from time to time."

Alan's suggested recommendation:

- Eliminate the Safeguarding requirement
- Replace the OECD paragraph with a more generic requirement to review privacy and data-transfer issues. I think the reference to the OECD Guidelines, even with the caveat "as amended from time to time" is appropriate in the Bylaws.

Subgroup 3 – Law Enforcement Needs

- **LE.1:**

The ICANN Board should resolve that regular data gathering through surveys and studies are to be conducted by ICANN to inform a future assessment of the effectiveness of WHOIS in meeting the needs of law enforcement, as well as future policy development (including the current expedited Policy Development Process and related efforts).

- **LE.2:**

The ICANN Board should resolve that such surveys and/or studies to be conducted by ICANN also be extended to other RDS (WHOIS) users, such as cybersecurity professionals working with law enforcement.

WHOIS1 Rec 1 - Strategic Priority

- **Recommendation R1.1:**

The ICANN Board should put into place a forward-looking mechanism to monitor possible impacts on the RDS from legislative and policy developments around the world.

- **Recommendation R1.2:**

To support this mechanism, the ICANN Board should instruct the ICANN Organization to assign responsibility for monitoring legislative and policy development around the world and to provide regular updates to the Board.

- **Recommendation R1.3:**

The ICANN Board should update the Charter of its Board Working Group on RDS to ensure the necessary transparency of the group's work, such as by providing for records of meetings and meeting minutes, to enable future review of its activities.

Email from Cathrin on 15 August:

“I have also added a sentence to start to address Stephanie's well-founded concern, which I believe deserves more discussion on another call, as we had no time to delve into two points:

- the issue of how to criticize implementation of recommendations which may have been impossible to measure from the start, and*
- how we want to deal with the previous RT's recommendations - my recollection from the last F2F was that we would clarify somewhere that they were not superseded by the present report but I may be wrong.”*

WHOIS1 Rec11 - Common Interface

- **Recommendation R11.1:**

The ICANN Board should direct the ICANN Organization to define metrics or SLA's to be tracked and evaluated to determine consistency of results of queries and use of any common interface (existing or future) used to provide one-stop access to registration data across all gTLDs and registrars/resellers. Specific metrics that should be tracked for any such common interface include:

- How often are RDS (WHOIS) fields returned blank?
- How often is data displayed inconsistently (for the same domain name), overall and per gTLD)?
- How often does the tool not return any results, overall and per gTLD)?
- What are the causes for the above results?

WHOIS1 Rec11 - Common Interface

- **Recommendation R11.2:**

The ICANN Board should direct the ICANN Organization to continue to maintain the common interface to keep up to date with new policy developments or contractual changes for contracted parties to ensure that the common interface will display all publicly-available WHOIS output for each gTLD domain name registration available from contracted parties, i.e., both the registry and registrar WHOIS output port 43 could be shown in parallel.
