<b>13) Additional Information (optional):</b>	<p>Mei Lin Fung co-founded the <a href="#">People Centered Internet</a> with Vint Cerf, and earlier worked with Douglas Engelbart: they were the first 2 nodes on the Arpanet. She organized the <a href="#">40<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations</a> of the <a href="#">Mother of All Demos</a>, called <a href="#">Program for the Future</a> and <a href="#">TCP/IP</a>. An early pioneer in Customer Relationship Management, she was on the Oracle 2-person skunkworks team that designed and coded the first CRM system, OASIS. She studied finance at MIT under future Nobel winners <a href="#">Robert Merton</a> and <a href="#">Franco Modigliani</a>, before going to Silicon Valley to work for Intel, before working at Oracle under the leadership first of <a href="#">Tom Siebel</a> who later founded and sold Siebel Systems to Oracle, then <a href="#">Marc Benioff</a>, now CEO of Salesforce. As Socio Technical lead for the US DoD's initiative looking at the Future of Health, she co-authored the paper on the new <a href="#">Networked Leadership competencies</a> and <a href="#">Trail Guides and Trading Posts on the Journey to Health</a>. She is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts and a member of the World Economic Forum's Global Future Council on <a href="#">Digital Economy and Society</a>, and on the Steering Committee for the Internet for All initiative of the World Economic Forum. She is the nominated vice-chair for Internet Inclusion within the IEEE Internet Initiative.</p>
